Allied Health Year 1

Course Location St. Johns

- Prerequisites**
- 1) Students must have local approval based on high school graduation requirements.
 - 2) Students will be responsible to purchase a uniform.
 - 3) Students will need access to the internet for online instructional days.

This course is designed to present and explore basic concepts of the human biological sciences in anatomy, physiology, pathology and career exploration. Basic physical science, medical terminology, and other fundamental concepts of human health are also included. This course utilizes in-class education and training sessions, lab sessions, and field trips aimed at preparing individuals for careers in health care. This course is a prerequisite for the Allied Health Internship course.

Accuplacer Assessment

To be eligible to receive Lansing Community College (LCC) credit for the course, students are **required** to take the Accuplacer assessment exam and obtain the listed minimum scores. LCC will admit students before the beginning of the school year as a necessary step prior to Accuplacer testing. The exam is taken as part of the course in the fall.

LCC staff will admit all incoming Career Connections students prior to the end of the current school year. At the session, students will need to bring their driver's license and Social Security card, as well as supply their full legal name, Social Security number, and correct address, including apartment numbers or P.O. box numbers. Schools will let students know the date when this enrollment is scheduled.

If on the first attempt a student does not attain the required scores, retakes are an option. The Accuplacer exam can be waived if a student submits ACT or SAT test results for verification that list comparable scores. Further Accuplacer exam information is available from the course instructor or by calling the Lansing Community College North Campus at 989-224-2017.

Direct Course Credits

Career Connections students are eligible for both high school and Lansing Community College credit. As is the case with all classes, students must earn the credit; it is not automatically granted by simply attending the class.

Students enrolling in this course are also enrolled at LCC. There will be an official transcript that lists grades by class at the end of the school year.

When sending application information to post-secondary institutions (colleges, universities, community colleges, trade schools, etc.), students should include the credit information listed on this sheet so that admissions counselors fully understand the makeup of this Career Connections course. High school counselors should include this information on official school transcripts as well. Ultimately, **students** bear the responsibility of conveying the LCC class information to post-secondary institutions.

Course Location St. Johns

Prerequisites

- 1) Students must have local approval based on high school graduation requirements.
- 2) Allied Health I.
- 3) Students will be required to purchase a uniform.
- 4) Students must complete the intent to return process.
- 5) Instructor approval.

Admittance into the program is based on multiple factors including but not limited to:

- 1) Allied Health I grades.
- 2) Reference letter.
- 3) A student written paper.
- 4) Interview with advisory board members.

Field Placement Requirements

To provide up-to-date immunization record and take a two-step TB skin test. Details will be forthcoming.

This module-based course for seniors is designed to present and provide limited career exploration opportunities for multiple health care careers in the following core areas: Dental, Nursing, Medical Assisting, Imaging Technology areas (Radiology and Sonography), Laboratory and Technology related areas, Special Needs Health Care, Surgical Technology, Integrated and Holistic areas (Nutrition, Massage, etc.), Pre-Medicine related areas, Physical Therapy related areas (including Occupational Therapy, Sports Medicine, etc.), and Age Based Health areas (including Pediatrics, Geriatrics, etc.). These core areas are based on availability of mentors in the career fields and may be subject to change. Students will rotate through modules to explore duties and responsibilities within each career.

Time will be spent between the modular components of the course reviewing employability skills and attributes designed to assist the student with assessing their career selection fit, and the development of self-promotion, interviewing, and general employability skills.



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
